Dear IDEAL Families:

It has been a pleasure partnering with you and sharing in your children's moments of personal and academic growth throughout the year. It is hard to believe that we are already looking ahead to the 2017-18 school year.

The summer work developed by our English department is designed to cultivate our students' love of reading, curiosity, and background knowledge. There are two parts to the Middle School's summer reading assignment:

1. **All Eighth grade students will be reading *Wonder*, Raquel J. Palacio**

(the summary below is from Goodreads.com)

This book is about August (Auggie) Pullman was born with a facial deformity that prevented him from going to a mainstream school—until now. He's about to start 5th grade at Beecher Prep, and if you've ever been the new kid then you know how hard that can be. The thing is Auggie's just an ordinary kid, with an extraordinary face. But can he convince his new classmates that he's just like them, despite appearances?

2. **One book from List:** In addition to *Wonder* we are requiring all Eighth gradeschool students to select and read one book from the attached list. Students may purchase their books, read electronic or kindle versions, or borrow from the library.

To guide students' reading of *Wonder*, the English department will be sending home packets with comprehension questions, in both hardcopy and digital form on June 15. Students should complete these questions and be prepared to discuss *Wonder* when they return to school. Students should also complete the attached reading log to keep track of the book they read from the list of choices, as well as any books they read on their own, and be prepared to discuss one additional selected book upon their return in the fall. In individualized cases, we will be reaching out shortly with a differentiated reading list.

The math department's summer work is designed to give students ongoing practice at the appropriate skill level. The department is requiring students to complete at least six hours of online math work, based on your child's current level over the summer. Students will each be provided with a math log to record their math work. Karin Wolff, the Director of Technology, will be in touch on June 15th, with your child's current IXL level, usernames, and passwords.

We wish everyone a relaxing and wonderful summer, filled with adventures and lots of laughter. Please work with your child to help with the selection of books and with the pacing of reading and math assignments so that it does not become overwhelming.
